

Applications are invited for a postdoctoral fellowship within the Department of Infectious Diseases and Global Public Health at University of California San Diego.

We are seeking a motivated candidate to assist with the implementation and evaluation of project 2VIDA!, a NIH funded multilevel intervention to address individual, social, and contextual factors related to access, acceptance, and uptake of the COVID-19 vaccine among Latinx and AA adults in San Diego.

Completive applicants will have research goals in the fields of public health or community based participatory research (CBPR). Their planned research should align with the project's themes.

- 1. Addressing COVID-19 vaccine hesitancy, uptake, and implementation among Latinx and African American communities
- 2. Health Disparities and comorbidities related to COVID-19
- 3. Community health promotion, education, and empowerment

This highly interdisciplinary research will involve collaboration with clinicians, statisticians, policymakers, community members, and public health researchers. The postdoctoral scholar will work under the primary supervision of Dr. Argentina Servin. (https://profiles.ucsd.edu/argentina.servin).

The initial appointment will be for one year, with option for renewal for up to two additional years based on performance. Applicants should have a PhD in a relevant discipline (global health, epidemiology, statistics, or related fields). Salary will be commensurate with qualification and experience and include travel to conferences/collaborators. Applicants from under-represented minority populations are encouraged to apply.
